Forms of employment

In Germany, a distinction is made between different forms of employment, which differ in terms of social security contributions.

• Geringfügige Beschäftigung (Minijob)

With a mini-job you can earn up to 520€ a month without having to pay social security contributions. However, this income limit applies to all mini-jobs together. Several smaller mini-jobs are added together. You can be exempted from the pension insurance upon application.

• Werkstudent*in (Working student job)

If a student is employed as a working student, neither the student nor the employer pays health, nursing care or unemployment insurance contributions from this employment. Only the contribution to pension insurance is due. The prerequisite is that the main focus is on studying and that the student is only working part-time. Therefore, the number of hours per week for working students is generally limited to 20 hours per week. However, there are exceptions.

• Midijob

Employed students aren't exempt from insurance contribution but if your regular earnings fall between 520,01 \in and 1600 \in a month contributions are smaller than if you are a full time employee. The contributions to the pension insurance are set lower in favour of the net income. Taxes are due according to the wage tax class. Social security contributions are set on an increasing scale. Starting at 1600 \in the full contribution rate to the social security must be paid.

• Kurzfristige Beschäftigung (short term employment)

This form of employment is restricted to a maximum of three months or 70 workdays in the calendar year. The amount of income isn't relevant for this type of employment. It is a requirement, that the duration of the employment relationship is determined with a contract. (e.g. working in a fair) beforehand.

<u>Note:</u> In addition to short-term employment, low paid employment (mini-job) is possible. The two occupations are not added together. Short-term employment is subject to income tax. However, students who are employed for a short period of time do not pay additional contributions to health, nursing care, unemployment and pension insurance.

• Jobbing and BAföG

If you receive BAföG and are employed (not self-employed!), your gross income can be up to 6240€ during the granted period (usually 12 months) or 520€/*month* without the amount of BAföG support changing.
